SCOPE OF POSITIONS:

Teachers support, observe and record the progress of their class. They also plan lessons in line with provincial and community school-based outcomes with the aim of ensuring a healthy culture of learning.

A teacher must also keep up to date with developments in their subject areas, new resources, methods, and provincial outcomes. The role involves collaborating with other professionals, parents, and guardians, both informally and formally.

A teacher employed in a school is accountable directly to the Band's board of education through the Principal of the school for the performance of the teacher's duties, responsibilities, and the overall educational progress of the pupils under the teacher's instruction.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Teaching certificate 5 valid in New Brunswick

REQUIREMENTS:
